



2nd stage 2002-2004 (EUR 5,800,000.00), and

3rd stage 2005-2008 (EUR 7,350,000.00).

6 (7) Number of books

The books taught in the Greek-speaking program of minority primary schools were generated by the Muslim Children Education Program. 55 books are intended for pupils (textbooks and exercise books) and 15 are auxiliary tools for teachers.

60,676 copies have been ordered for the next school year 2008-2009 for the pupils of all grades of primary minority schools and 2,769 copies for the teachers of the Greekspeaking program.

The books for the Turkish-speaking program come from Turkey, on the basis of an interstate agreement (Greek-Turkish Protocol of 1968).
