About Froebelian Futures

Froebelian Futures aims to empower and connect people working with young children via the radically child-centered practices of the the original kindergarten movement, founded by Friedrich Froebel (1782-1852). Froebel’s pedagogy has experienced a huge resurgence in recent years as children’s rights become central in debates about social and educational practice. Scotland, one of the hubs of this activity, now emphasizes Froebelian practice in its national curriculum – and we are delighted to share and grow in this work with our international partners, including Greece’s Network for Children’s Rights.

The training

Froebelian Futures will offer three levels of training in Athens in 2021-23:

- **Level One** – an introduction to Froebel and early childhood, certificated by Cowgate Under 5s and the Network for Children’s Rights (Oct-Nov 2021 – online - details below).
- **Level Two** – Practitioner Inquiry training – developing “on the job” research skills for practitioners to help you actively strengthen children’s rights in day-to-day early learning and childcare. Certificated by the University of Edinburgh. (May-June 2022 – in person).
- **Level Three** – Froebelian Leadership – building leadership skills to inspire broader social and policy change for young children’s everyday lives, based on Froebel’s principles. Certificated by The University of Edinburgh. (spring 2023 – in person).

Participants must undertake each level in order to progress to the next one, but there is no obligation to undertake all three levels. **All training is delivered free of charge** thanks to generous support from The Froebel Trust (Froebel.org.uk).

Level One – An introduction to Froebel and early childhood

When: Online (**Zoom**), October 25-26, November 2,3,8,9 from 4:30-6:30pm Greek time.

What: You will learn widely about Froebel’s own practice as well as current Froebelian thinking, in relation to children’s rights, social justice, play, learning, inclusion and anti-racism.

Assessment: There is no formal assessment for this course, but you will be asked to keep a reflective journal about your practice and summarize it for the network online.

Training will be held in English, with Greek translation support.
